Living Like God’s Not Dead

A song and two movies have made the phrase "God's Not Dead" well-known in the Christian community. It's easy to sing the song along with the Newsboys: "My God's not dead, He's surely alive. He's living on the inside roaring like a lion..." It's even easier to watch the movies and cheer along with the outspoken Christians proclaiming that God is not dead.

But, like with most things in life, do we ever pause to truly think about what the words of the song are saying and the point of the movies? Let’s do so now. Do we live like God isn't dead? We celebrate His resurrection at Easter, but do we keep that celebration going throughout the year? The answer to this is often difficult to admit. It's generally not something we think about that often, but it an essential truth our lives should reflect. Think about it: God. Is. Not. Dead. That should cause us to go into the Hallelujah Chorus! Other religions worship dead gods, but our God is alive! No matter how bad my worst day is, remembering that God is alive and is in control of everything is enough to lift the weights off my shoulders. God can handle anything I go through because HE IS ALIVE!

Since God is alive and lives inside of everyone who accepts Him as Lord and Savior, our lives should be roaring for Him like a lion. Think about that imagery for a moment. When a lion roars, it does not do so half-heartedly. It doesn't roar quietly. It roars loudly enough to get everyone's attention. That's what our lives should sound like. We should be constantly roaring for Christ and doing it so loud that we get everyone's attention. Another semester of Project 6:23 has already begun, so let’s roar like lions as we go out and visit the people in our community. Roar like a lion and share the Gospel with people at school or work. Our everyday lives should show us roaring like lions for Christ. It's easier to sing the song and watch the movies than it is to live your life like God's not dead, but it should be every Christian's goal to live in light of that truth, roaring loudly that He is very much alive.
